like a Fall theme, Christmas theme.

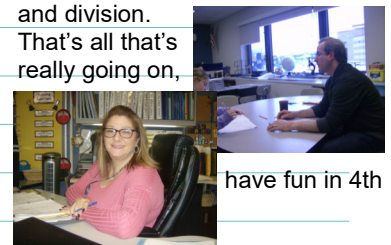


4th Grade at Masonic Heights
